Students can become part of the most successful career launching programs in Canada: Earn-while-you learn through Co-op Education. In the Co-operative Education program, students alternate semesters of academic study with periods of paid employment in a position in industry, government, or other organization that is related to each student’s interests and field of study. Workterms of 4, 8, 12 or 16 month duration, depending on the program of study, become an integral part of the student’s education.

Co-operative Education links education to employment. Students benefit by gaining paid relevant work experience, connections for future permanent employment, hands-on information regarding their career choice, and the development of personal confidence to become successful individuals. Students who successfully complete the specified number of co-op work term courses and work terms receive nine credits per work term and a Co-operative Education Designation on their diploma.

Admission Requirements

Students must be accepted into their program of study prior to applying for the Co-operative Education program. The deadline for application is approximately two weeks after the beginning of the Fall Semester. Students must complete an application form and participate in an interview to determine acceptance into the program. Students must maintain a GPA of 2.0 or higher and complete all first year courses prior to their first work term to continue in the Co-op program.

Upon acceptance into Co-operative Education, students pay their Co-op fees plus any other associated fees (please refer to the College Fee Schedule). The Co-op Education Coordinator will mentor students through a series of mandatory workshops and assist students to secure appropriate paid work placements with approved employers. Upon successful completion of the program requirements designed to build appropriate workplace skills and long term career success, every effort will be made to secure meaningful and program-related work placements for all students. Students may be required to undergo a competitive interviewing process or they may be placed with employers. The final selection is at the discretion of the employer. The College will make a “best effort” to assist all Co-op students to secure approved work placements of the required duration; however, it is not guaranteed.

To exercise the student right to tryout, intentions must be revealed to the program Head Coach or Athletic Director in the first week of classes in September.

The Huskies are members of the Alberta Colleges Athletic Conference and compete against eighteen other institutions across Alberta and Saskatchewan. Athletes who are members of the volleyball and soccer teams are eligible for a Jimmy Condon Award and/or a Student Athlete Enrollment Bursary.

To be eligible for the Jimmie Condon Award (\$900.00 per semester) athletes must attain a minimum GPA of 2.2. Soccer and Volleyball players are also eligible to receive the Student Athlete Enrollment Bursary (minimum GPA of 1.7) in the amount totalling the difference between enrollment fees (tuition, recreation, registration and KCSA fees) and their Jimmie Condon Scholarship Award. Athletes not eligible for the Jimmie Condon award (ie. out of province students) qualify to receive 100% of enrollment costs. All athletes are eligible to apply for additional scholarships and awards.

Riedel Place

Riedel Place is the Keyano College Family Residence Complex and is situated at 8820 Franklin Avenue, one and a half kilometres from the Clearwater Campus. It is on a main city transit route and is within walking distance of schools, shopping facilities, restaurants and other amenities.

Riedel Place has a total of 104 units and is comprised of 3 & 4 bedroom townhouses and 1 & 3 bedroom apartments. Each unit contains a stove and fridge.

- Accommodation is assigned from a priority wait list.
- Students must be registered in their program prior to applying for Housing.
- Students are advised to apply for housing well in advance of their program start date.

- A full month's rent, plus a damage deposit equivalent to one month's rent, is required prior to moving in.

Workforce Development

Workplace Essential Skills Training

Keyano College offers customized essential skill programs (such as Safety & Workplace Reading, Workplace Applied Math, Writing in the Workplace, and Procedure Writing) to business, industry, labour groups, education and government. These programs include individual consultations and small-group workshops designed to refresh and reinforce essential skills – reading, writing and math – using workplace-specific applications. Community Programming

Two continuing education calendars are published per year. These course offerings represent more than 450 different courses in diverse and interesting areas of study including computer skills, arts and crafts, languages, business development and management, communication skills, supervisory tools, health and fitness, online offerings, and evening credit courses. These courses meet the needs of people seeking personal enrichment as well as those wanting professional development. Continuing education courses are open to all adults 18 years of age or older unless courses are specifically advertised for children. There are no prerequisites unless specified in the course description. To view the Continuing Education Calendar go to keyano.ca.

Regional Programs

Within the Community and Upgrading Education Division, the Chairperson of Aboriginal Education responds to the educational requests from the communities within our region. The Adult Learning Centres in Fort McKay, Gregoire Lake, Janvier and Conklin offer Academic Foundations, College Preparation and other programs to meet local education and training needs. Each regional Learning Centre is also a recognized Alberta North CAP site offering various programs via alternate delivery.

Language Instruction for Newcomers to Canada (LINC)

The Language Instruction to Newcomers to Canada program is designed to provide basic English language training to adult newcomers. LINC will facilitate the social, cultural and economic integration of immigrants and refugees into Canada so they may feel like participating members of Canadian society as quickly as possible. To be eligible to attend LINC courses, participants must have landed immigrant status. LINC is a federally funded program and is reviewed on a yearly basis. Program offerings are dependent on available funding. Further details can be obtained from the Community and Upgrading Education Division at (780) 791-4858.



Fort Chipewyan Campus

The Community and Upgrading Education Division manages Keyano’s campus in Fort Chipewyan, Alberta. The College has a strong commitment to Aboriginal education and has been involved with the community of Fort Chipewyan since 1976. Credit instruction is offered principally in the adult upgrading programs of Academic Foundations and College Preparation. Post-secondary credit courses may also be offered as the need arises in other areas, such as, Business Administration, Early Childhood Development and Office Administration. Short non-credit general interest courses are delivered each semester. Community driven programming plays a key role in enhancing educational opportunities and developing capacity in the community of Fort Chipewyan.

Keyano College also manages the Community Access Point (CAP) sites in Fort Chipewyan, Fort McKay, Janvier, Gregoire Lake, and Conklin. This is an Alberta North initiative with the objective of providing a network of educational services and programs to northern Alberta communities through distance education technology.
