

## **ACP 516, Introductory Life Support**

3 Credits, 45 Hours lecture

## **Course Description**

This course explores the fundamental aspects of paramedic practice and life support of patients. Topics include safety, priorities of approach and assessment for medical and trauma patients, and professional communication.

**CLO1:** Identifying real or potential hazards in a variety of situations and environments.

CLO2: Characterization of hazards using standardized identification systems, such as WHMIS and CBRNE.

CLO3: Discussing equipment and measures to address potential occupational hazards.

CLO3: Explaining priorities of prehospital patient assessment of medical and trauma presentations.

CLO4: Explaining physiological principles and interpretation of basic vital signs and diagnostics.

CLO5: Discussing components of professional communication required for verbal and written reports, as well as interaction with the patient.

CLO6: Describing the role and implications of aeromedical patient transport.
