

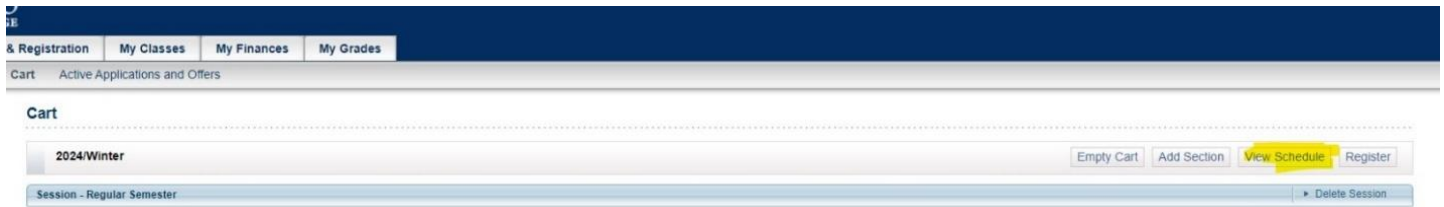

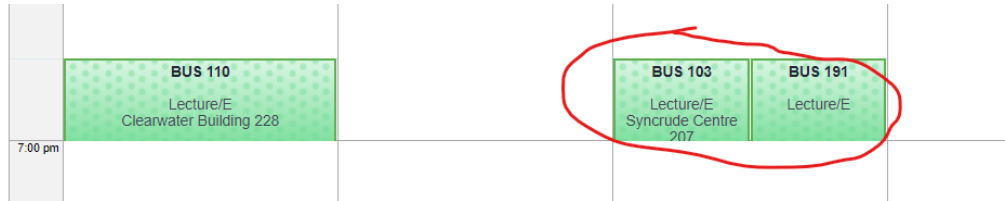

6. Continue to add courses, checking for time conflicts after each addition.

Program of Study: Bachelor of Science in Nursing Degree

This collaborative degree program four years

Year 1 and 2 each consist of two 4-month terms and one 6-week term.

Year 3 consists of two 4-month terms.

Year 4, during which you are a student of the University of Alberta while remaining at Keyano College in Fort McMurray, consists of two 4-month terms.

There is a fast-track option, in which students progress in consecutive terms with no breaks.

Progression Policy:

- A minimum of C+ is required to pass all foundational nursing courses (NURS 106, BURS 116, NURS 120, NURS 124, NURS 125, MMI 133)
- A minimum of a C- is required to pass all other nursing and non-nursing courses.
- For a yearly promotion, a student must have successfully completed all courses from the previous year, and obtain a minimum GPA of 2.0.
- Students with a semester GPA of 1.7 to 1.99 will be placed on academic probation for one semester.
- A student with a GPA of 1.69 or lower must withdraw from the program.
- If the GPA warrants a second academic probation within the program the student will be required to withdraw from the program and will not be readmitted into the program.
- Readmission to the program is subject to departmental review by the Chair and Dead of the program and alignment with College Policies.
- Students who fail a second clinical course or a clinical course for the second time will be required to withdraw from the program and will not be readmitted

Transferability: For information on transfer to various post-secondary institutions, please refer to the Alberta Transfer Guide at transferalberta.alberta.ca. Please note that every institution has its own policy regarding minimum grades needed for transfer credit.

Based on the number of credits required in an academic year, the number of credits required to reach Full Time (FT) status can vary.

You may reduce your course load and do fewer courses per term, but it will take you longer than four terms to graduate and you will incur additional costs.
